

WITH 'UNBUNDLED' LINE ITEMS ON YOUR MONTHLY BILL, YOU CAN SEE A MORE COMPLETE ENERGY PICTURE.

Your monthly Pacific Power bill presents the charges for the energy you used and the delivery of energy to you as separate line items. There is also a public purpose charge, a result of Oregon's electricity restructuring law. Please take a moment to review the sample billing statement shown here.

BASIC CHARGE:

Charge for costs incurred for metering, meter reading, billings, etc. This does not include demand or energy use.

DELIVERY CHARGE:

This charge for transmission and delivery of electricity has always appeared on your bill, but was previously bundled with the cost of electricity, now called Basic Service Energy.

BASIC SERVICE ENERGY:

This is the cost of the electricity you use, tiered, based on the number of kilowatt-hours you use each month. This was previously bundled with charges for transmission and delivery of electricity.

TIME OF USE (TOU):

Under this plan, customers are billed just as they would be on Basic Service, with adjustments for electricity used during on-peak and off-peak hours, plus a \$1.50 per month meter charge.

PUBLIC PURPOSE:

A Public Purpose charge took effect March 1, 2002, as a part of Oregon's restructuring law. It directs three percent of your total monthly electric bill to nonprofit organizations for energy efficiency, renewable power, and low-income weatherization and housing.

LOW INCOME ASSISTANCE:

Since January 1999, the state's two investor-owned electric utilities have been required by the state to collect this money for low-income bill assistance, administered by Oregon Housing and Community Services.

CREDIT RESULTING FROM MERGER:

When ScottishPower purchased PacifiCorp, Pacific Power's parent company, the efficiencies realized resulted in a credit to the company's Oregon customers.

BPA ENERGY DISCOUNTS:

A credit to residential and small farm customers passing along their share of benefits from the federal hydropower system.

CITY TAX:

We are required by city ordinance to pay cities this tax, based on our billed revenue. This is not a new charge.
