Pursuant to Rule 3.2(c) of the California Public Utilities Commission's ("Commission") Rules of Practice and Procedure, PacifiCorp, d.b.a. Pacific Power ("Company"), files this Notice of Compliance. Rule 3.2(c) of the Commission Rules of Practice and Procedure requires utilities within 10 days after the filing of a rate increase application to "publish at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the increases are proposed to be made effective a notice, in general terms, of the proposed increase in rates." Further, Rule 3.2(c) states that "[a]pplicants shall file proof of compliance within 10 days after publication." 

Pacific Power notice of proposed Solar Incentive Program and Proposed New Surcharge

On March 1, 2010, Pacific Power filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting permission to implement a solar incentive program in its California service territory. The proposed program would provide incentive payments to customers that install solar photovoltaic equipment at their homes and businesses in order to offset some or all of their electricity usage. If approved, the solar incentive program would be funded through a new surcharge designed to collect the proposed program budget of approximately \$1.16 million per year. This proposed new surcharge results in an increase only to customers of Pacific Power not served under California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) rate schedules. Funds collected through this surcharge would only be used to pay customer incentives and cover the cost of administering the program.

The CPUC could approve the program as proposed, modify the proposed program, or not approve the program. If approved, the surcharge would have the following estimated average increase to each customer class listed below:

Customer class	Proposed percentage increase	Proposed dollar increase
Residential	1.2 percent	\$520,000
Commercial and Industrial	1.3 percent	\$480,000
Irrigation	1.3 percent	\$160,000
Streetlighting	1.4 percent	\$5,000
Overall	1.3 percent	\$1,165,000

Customers that take service under CARE rate schedules are not subject to the proposed surcharge.

You may submit written comments to the CPUC's Public Advisor's Office (PAO) at the address or e-mail shown below. Please state that you are writing concerning PacificCorp's solar incentive program application. Your comments will become a part of the formal correspondence file for public comment in this proceeding. The Public Advisor's Office will circulate your comments to the five Commissioners, the assigned Administrative Law Judge (ALJ), the Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA), and to CPUC staff assigned to this proceeding.
