NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE WITH RULE 3.2(D)**

Pursuant to Rule 3.2(d) of the California Public Utilities Commission's ("Commission") Rules of Practice and Procedure, PacifiCorp, d.b.a. Pacific Power ("Company"), files this Notice of Compliance. Rule 3.2(d) requires that "within 45 days, if the corporation operates on a 30-day billing cycle, or within 75 days, if the corporation operates on a 60-day or longer billing cycle, after the filing of the application to increase any rate of charge...[the applicant] shall furnish its customers affected by the proposed increase notice of its application either by mailing such notice postage prepaid to such customers or by including such notice with the regular bill for charges transmitted to such customers." Further, Rule 3.2(d) states that "[a]pplicants shall file proof of compliance within 10 days after mailing."

PacifiCorp filed Application 10-05-009 on May 7, 2010. PacifiCorp operates on a 30-day billing cycle. All notices required by Rule 3.2(d) were accomplished within the timeframe specified in the rule as certified in the Declaration of Berit Kling, Communications Specialist, attached hereto as Exhibit A. Exhibit A includes Attachment

A, which contains a copy of the notice inserted into customer bills.



Pacific Power Notice of Application for a Rate Increase to Recover Costs Recorded in the Catastrophic Event Memorandum Account

On May 7, 2010, Pacific Power filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting authorization to establish a rate surcharge beginning January 1, 2011, to recover costs incurred in restoring service to customers and repairing damage caused by the severe winter storms during January 2010. Pacific Power is allowed to record costs related to qualifying events in its Catastrophic Event Memorandum Account (CEMA). The costs requested for recovery by Pacific Power are only those that will not be recovered from insurance. The filing will be examined by the CPUC to determine if the costs are reasonable and eligible for recovery before any rate increase will be approved.

The proposed surcharge is designed to collect approximately \$1.36 million over a 1-year period. If approved, the surcharge would result in the following estimated average increase to each customer class listed below:

Customer class	Proposed percentage increase	Proposed dollar increase
Residential	1.8 percent	\$780,000
Commercial and Industrial	1.3 percent	\$400,000
Irrigation	1.6 percent	\$160,000
Streetlighting	2.2 percent	\$15,000
Overall	1.6 percent	\$1,355,000

EVIDENTIARY HEARINGS

Evidentiary Hearings (EH) may be held for this proceeding. At the EH, the formal parties of record can present testimony and be cross-examined before the assigned Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). The EH is

open to the public, but only parties to the proceeding may present evidence or cross-examine witnesses. If you wish to become a party and participate in the EH hearings, please contact the CPUC's Public Advisor's Office at the address shown below. Parties at these hearings may offer proposals to the CPUC that differ from those requested by Pacific Power. After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. The CPUC's final decision may be different from Pacific Power's proposal.

THE CPUC PROCESS

The CPUC's Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) is an independent arm of the CPUC created by the Legislature to present the interests of all utility customers throughout the state to obtain the lowest possible rates while maintaining safe and reliable service. DRA has a multidisciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting and engineering. DRA may review the application and offer its assessment of Pacific Power's proposal and submit its independent analysis and recommendations in written reports for the CPUC's consideration. The reports will be available to the public and will be posted to DRA's website.

PUBLIC COMMENT OR PROTESTS

You may submit written comments to the CPUC's Public Advisor's Office at the address or e-mail shown below. Please state that you are writing concerning PacifiCorp's CEMA application. Your comments will become a part of the formal correspondence file for public comment in this proceeding. The Public Advisor's Office will circulate your comments to the five Commissioners, the assigned Administrative Law Judge, the Division of Ratepayer Advocates, and to CPUC staff assigned to this proceeding.


