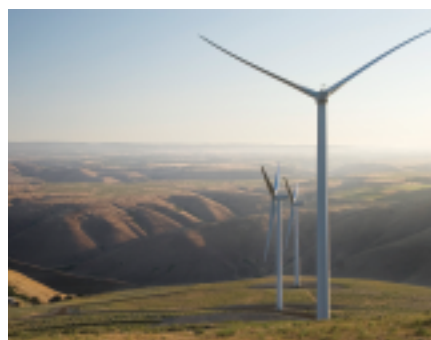
## Raising the bar

Since 1981, Pacific Power has been working to develop renewable resources to serve our customers' energy needs, and now we're working toward adding 2,000 megawatts of new cost-effective renewable energy to our system by 2013. Based on today's figures, that's enough energy to serve the equivalent of 560,000 typical homes.

We're well on the way to meeting this goal. For example, Goodnoe Hills, a 94-megawatt wind project near Goldendale, Washington, began operating in late spring and Marengo II, in Dayton, Washington, is also expected to go into service this summer.

These projects are all in addition

## Habitat project spotlight

### A tidal treasure becomes new reserve

Few intact remnants of Oregon's coastal rainforest system remain, but the Crosel Creek Habitat Reserve is one of them.

With help from \$13,000 contributed by Blue Sky Habitat option customers, in partnership with The Nature Conservancy, Crosel Creek Habitat Reserve was recently established.

"You don't see many tidal areas in Youngs Bay that are still intact and functioning naturally," said Katie Voelke, North Coast Land Conservancy land steward. "It's equally rare to see a stream like Crosel Creek that has such good habitat."



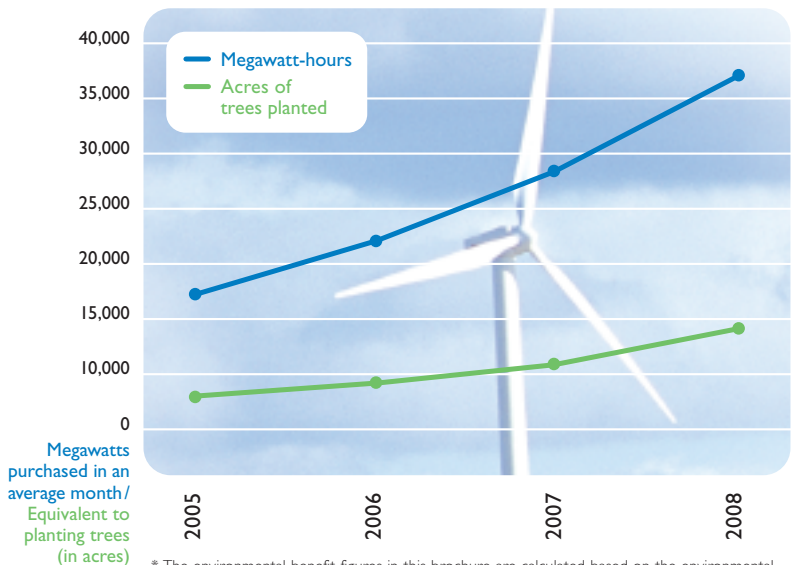
