## Comparing your **Power Options**

Electricity can be generated in a number of ways. This quarterly brochure helps you compare the prices, fuel sources and environmental impact of electricity options available to you. We hope you find this information helpful.

## Cost comparison

Under Oregon's restructuring law, we are required to provide price, power source and environmental impact information to customers quarterly. As an example, the comparison uses rate schedule 48, primary delivery voltage, for a monthly kilowatt-hour (kwh) usage of 1,750,000 (4 megawatts). The prices used in these charges reflect the energy portion of your bill charged under Supply Service rate schedules 200, 201 and 202.

Prices are current as of March 1, 2010. The prices do not reflect Supply Service adjustment rate schedule 203, Delivery Service charges, other adjustment rate schedules or local taxes.

## Supply mix

The portion supplied by Pacific Power is based on recent utility production and purchases (may not equal 100 percent due to rounding). For further explanation of the resources listed in the supply mix charts, go to [pacificpower.net/rates](http://pacificpower.net/rates).

Supply mix shown here is based on 2006 net system resources.

Amounts of pollutants per kilowatt-hour of supply mix, compared to the Northwest U.S. average.

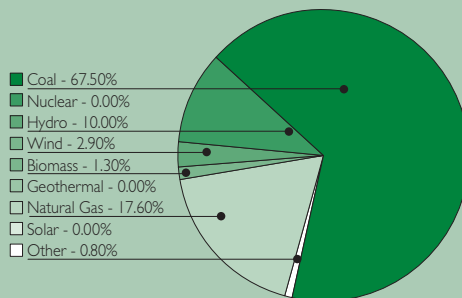
