LC 82 Order 24-073:

#8 Direct PacifiCorp to work collaboratively with Staff, stakeholders, peer utilities, environmental justice groups, and CBIAGs in a dedicated working group to develop clear, actionable improvements to community and stakeholder engagement in subsequent IRP/CEPs by December 31, 2024. If PacifiCorp cannot complete this effort by this timeline, PacifiCorp should provide a detailed status update and explanation of how it will ensure that remaining issues are resolved as soon as practicable, inclusive of the perspectives of peer utilities and the utilities' CBIAGs.

Ways we aim to increase engagement by:


- Focusing on accessibility (hybrid meetings, translation of resources for certain spaces, using plain language)

- Post-meeting surveys for advisory groups




Survey | Overview






Suggestions on Improving Engagements

- Provide workshops opportunities



Facilitated Discussion



Discussion Guardrails

Equity of Time



Facilitators will set a timer for each speaker before questions and dialogue. After each person who wants to speak has an opportunity, we will follow up with those who want to speak again.

Open Dialogue



Speakers will be allowed to discuss a variety of engagement topics during their time. If a speaker would like the moderator to pull up a document, they can send a direct message with the link or image to Jeffrey, Tag, Morgan, or Zanya.

Develop Clarity



After each speaker, there will be time set aside for those seeking clarity and those wanting to further specific dialogue. The facilitator will call on participants in the order that they have used the raise hand-feature.

Be Present



We ask all participants in our dialogue session to be on camera (if possible) so we can create meaningful connections with those on the line.

Be Respectful



We ask all participants to engage each other with respect, understanding that each person brings their unique and valuable lived experiences and expertise.
