2025 Key Activities / Dates

Integrated Resource Plan

- January 1, 2025, PacifiCorp's draft Integrated Resource Plan is distributed.
- January 22-23, 2025, PacifiCorp hosts an IRP Public Input Meeting virtually.
- February 26-27, 2025, PacifiCorp hosts an IRP Public Input Meeting virtually.
- March 31, 2025, PacifiCorp's final Integrated Resource Plan document is filed.

2025 CEIP Public Participation Plan

• Due May 1, 2025 (every odd numbered year)

- Provides an update of Pacific Power's public participation plan engagement activities.
- Topics include outreach, timing, methods, barriers to participation, and accessibility measures.
- In place to foster inclusion and equitable participation in Pacific Power's public processes.

2025 Clean Energy Implementation Plan

• Due October 1, 2025

- Pacific Power will provide a draft 2025 Clean Energy Implementation Plan to advisory groups and interested parties 45 days prior to the final filing date.
- Pacific Power will host a Clean Energy Implementation Plan Engagement Series Meeting in August to discuss the draft and hold space for feedback.
- Pacific Power will continue to outline the process for comments and feedback (informed by advisory group feedback along the way).
- Pacific Power will review all submitted comments and feedback and update its draft prior to the final the filing date.

Feedback Tracker

Goals:

- Publish an update each quarter (Pacific Power staff will review, validate, and respond to feedback as needed)
- Provide a summary of comments received during the development of Pacific Power's Clean Energy Implementation Plan

Features:

- Formatted in Excel (in progress; currently offered as PDF)
- Is state specific and includes the month, year, meeting space where the feedback was provided, and notes the topic category to establish context and shared understanding

Vulnerable Populations Workshop II Recap

Meeting goals:



1. Detail current vulnerable populations and Condition 14 settlement vulnerability factors



2. Review approach to defining census tracts that are vulnerable



- 3. Discuss options for changes to geographic methodology and anticipated outcomes
 - Presented an alternative methodology based on geographic measures to define vulnerable census tracts. This will be used alongside Washington Department of Health's Highly Impacted Communities (HIC) definition
 - 22 Vulnerable Populations used as criteria
 - 26 metrics identified in CBI Settlement Condition 14
 - 26 census tracts in Yakima County, 6 census tracts in Walla Walla County, 1 census tract each in Columbia County, Garfield County, and Kittitas County considered vulnerable

Vulnerable Populations Workshop II Recap

Feedback received:


- "...would like to understand if the key vulnerability factors that are identified by customers align with those that made the final cut as outlined in the presentation."
- Home care might be defined as a service where someone would come into the residence to cook and care for a patient with physical and/or mental limitations.
- Consider benefits that other areas of the state may have access to such as clean water, clean air, and solar
- The count of homeless shelters could be a possible measure for homelessness vulnerability as homeless population stay near to shelters

Changes incorporated since Workshop II:


- Included the following metrics
 - Fine particulate matter pollution (PM2.5)
 - Percent of customers within census tract with recorded medical certification
 - Percent of customers within census tract without private generation
